this year you will get more insight in intercultural differences, manners of communication and styles of negotiation by means of well substantiated theory, practice cases and working in an international classroom.

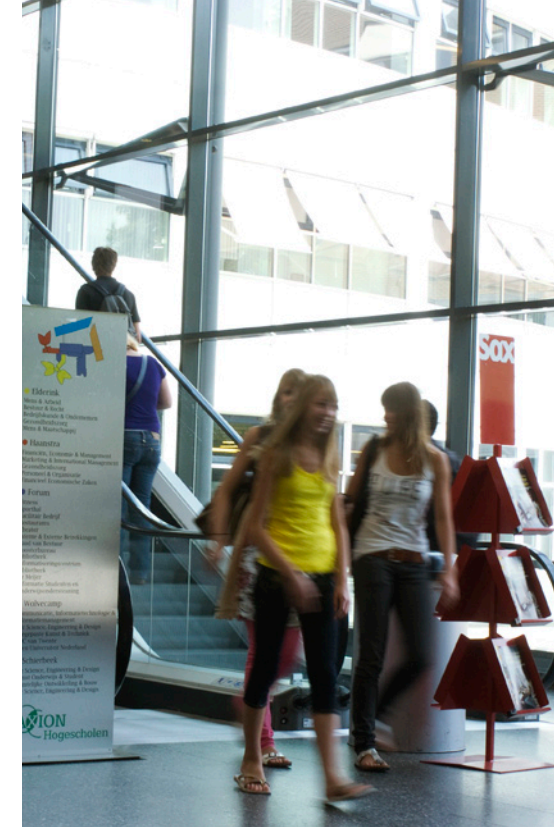
After you are finished with this programme you will be awarded with the title Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA).

Graduation Assignment

Students work as an international interdisciplinary team on a practice orientated research assignment, formulated by one of our partners in international business and governance. By means of these experiences in 'real life' intercultural management, students get acquainted with intercultural aspects of working in an international setting and learning to deal with cultural differences. Assignments may concern issues like integrity in public contracting, cross border cooperation in law enforcement, legal advice on international business expansion, comparative research on the establishment of legal entities, legal aspects within the European internal market and international markets.
