Overview costs first year students Tourism Management 2026-2027

Below you will find an overview of costs you may expect during your first year of the Tourism Management (TM) study programme at the Hospitality Business School (HBS). The costs mentioned in this overview are an indication. No rights can be derived from this overview.

1. Tuition fee

Every student, who registers for a course at the university, needs to pay tuition fees. For the academic year 2026-2027 this amount is set at € 2.694. This amount applies for a full-time course. For students outside the EU region, please visit <https://www.saxion.edu/> for the 'fee structure'.

2. Dress code during occasions

In the tourism sector it is highly valued to be dressed appropriately for the occasion. For students of Tourism Management it is important to be aware of the matching clothing etiquette. There is no standard outfit or suit that you should purchase especially for the programme. It is your own responsibility to own and to wear presentable clothing and this can be expected from you on different occasions (exams and excursions). It may occur that we ask you to purchase these suitable clothing. During the course you will receive more information about this. You will also receive a personal name badge that you wear on your clothing during different occasions.

3. Credits abroad (for Dutch students only)

As a student of Tourism Management, you are obliged to gain at least 30 European Credits (EC) abroad. Depending on the education activities you would like to follow abroad to obtain these credits, there are costs involved.

4. Study Trips

Throughout your studies, various study trips are organized that form an integral part of specific modules. You are expected to participate in these trips, as certain module-related assignments must be completed during them. The costs of the study trips vary per academic year and per program. In the first year, the Tourism Management program offers two study trips (in the Netherlands and to Albania), for which you should budget approximately € 800 in total.

5. Excursions

As a student, you can participate in various excursions and company visits during your studies. The costs for these activities, including any travel expenses, are your own responsibility.

6. Literature, Study Trips, and Excursions

- To be able to participate in the study, you must purchase the appropriate literature (books, readers and teaching materials). In the literature list is stated which materials are obliged and which are recommended. You may choose yourself where you purchase the necessary materials.
- During your study, several study trips are an integral part of modules. You are expected to participate in the study trips. The modules are linked to substantive assignments, which through the study trips need to be completed. The costs of the study trips vary per course and academic year. The Tourism Management study programme offers one study trip.
- As a student you can participate in various excursions and company visits. The costs of the excursions should be paid by you, including the travel expenses.

7. Study Association

Viatozem is the study association for students of the Tourism Management program within the Hospitality Business School at Saxion. Our goal? To connect people within the program through events, so that members can build valuable connections and gain useful information. What kind of events? Social drinks, parties, and various other activities. To become a member, you can sign up via svviatozem.nl/word-lid. The membership fee is € 7.50 per year.

8. Other educational tools

In order to participate in the education, it is possible that you need to pay costs for additional learning materials, such as a calculator or a laptop.

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
